



2021 Summer Camp Parent Manual

Vision Statement

This recreational "playground" camp features creative group activities and opportunities for individual growth. Our goals are simple: to provide positive experiences for the development of leisure experiences, good sportsmanship, positive self-esteem, respect for others, teamwork, self-discipline, and most importantly—FUN!

Age Requirements

This camp is specifically designed for youth ages 6-12. A birth certificate may be required if there is a question about a child's correct age.

Camp Counselors

All Summer Camp counselors are employed by the Town of Kernersville. Each counselor has been drug-tested, passed a thorough background check, and has completed camp training. Our counselor-to-camper ratio is 3:10.

Time, Place, & Camp Day Options

This year camp will run for eight (8) weeks. Camp will meet from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm Monday thru Friday, June 14– August 13, 2021. The program will meet at Kernersville Parks and Recreation, located at 125 E. Bodenhamer Street. *Camp will not meet during the week of July 5-9, 2021.

Child Drop-Off and Pick-Up

There will be drop off/pick-up guidelines this year, we will be sending a detailed video link to parents on how this procedure will work. Please make sure you watch before your child's first day of camp. Please make arrangements to drop your child off *no earlier* than 7:30 am and pick them up *no later* than 5:30 pm. If your child is not picked up by 5:30 pm, your listed emergency contacts will be contacted. A late pick-up fee will also be utilized, which will be \$5.00 per each 10 minutes past your scheduled pick up time to be paid directly to the counselor.

We ask that you please notify the camp counselor <u>directly</u> if your child(ren) will not be attending camp on any day he/she is registered for, or if he/she will be arriving late or leaving early – preferably the day before in the form of a written note or email hwood@toknc.com. If your child is going to leave camp and ride with someone other than a parent, you will need to provide a written letter to the on-site staff.

Please be considerate of the rest of the camp and drop off your child(ren) at the above listed time. Due to program schedules, park adventures, and lunch schedules, we ask that you drop off your child by **9:00 a.m.** each morning to avoid delays in our activities, unless otherwise discussed.

Cost & Payment Information

- a) **ONLINE:** By registering your child online, you agree to pay ALL applicable camp fees at checkout. **\$145 /week for a FULL DAY of camp!**
- b) **PHONE:** By calling us at 336-996-3062, we will be happy to register your child(ren) via phone, M-F, 9:00 am-5:00 pm. The full week's registration fee of each week you would like for your child(ren) to attend camp will be due at the time of Registration. (All applicable fees apply, we accept Visa, Mastercard, Discover, and Amex.)
- c) **WALK-IN:** You may register your child in person **(By Appointment ONLY)** at our Administrative Offices at 125 E. Bodenhamer St., M-F, 9:00 am-4:00 pm. The full week's registration fee of each week you would like for your child(ren) to attend camp will be due at the time of registration. (All applicable fees apply, we accept credit, debit, check, and cash.)

EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION: Register your child on or before April 19th, 2021 and receive a 5% off discount.

**SIBLING DISCOUNT: (\$25 off discount) Sibling discount ONLY applies when you have two (2) or more children enrolled in the SAME week(s) of camp. Discount applies to second child registered. It does not apply to the total number of children in your household--only to those ENROLLED in Summer Camp. **Must call to receive discount*

Registration & Finance Information

We are unable to hold spots without payment. Payment is due in full in order for your child to attend camp. NO EXCEPTIONS. Financial Assistance application period for the Declan Donoghue Foundation is February 15th 2021 – March 15th 2021.

Refund Policy & Insufficient Funds

Kernersville Parks and Recreation does not issue refunds. Refunds or credits will not be given for any day a child is absent from the program. If you are unable to attend a week, you must notify the Parks and Recreation staff a **full week prior**. If extenuating circumstances force you to miss most of this program, you may ask for a refund in writing. This will be submitted to the Director of Parks and Recreation for review. If awarded, you will only be granted 80% of the full amount paid to date. Please make note that Insufficient Funds payments will be pursued with an additional \$25.00 fee. These payments will only be taken by cash or cashier's checks.

The Town of Kernersville accepts: Cash, Check, Visa, Discover, AMEX and Master Card on site or you can pay over the phone (336-996-3062) with a debit or credit card.

Payments can be delivered in person at 125 E. Bodenhamer St., M-F 9am-5pm, by appointment only.

Attendance

We ask that you please notify the Camp Director (Heather Wood – hwood@toknc.com) directly if your child(ren) will not be attending camp on any day he/she is registered for, or if he/she will be arriving late or leaving early. Attendance is taken on a daily basis, and it is very important for the counselors to be aware of a child's absence.

Authorized Persons

Only those persons with a drop off/ pick-up pass, we provide, will be allowed to pick up your child from camp. Should you need someone else to pick-up your child, you must notify our Camp Director (hwood@toknc.com) prior to pick up your child/ren.

Medication/Illness

Medication will not be given out to campers by any of our summer camp staff. If your child becomes ill while at camp, you will be called to come and get your child. Again, our staff cannot administer medication—but we will be able to assess any fever with a Temporal Scanner Infrared Thermometer and report those to the parent. We will err on the side of caution and always make a phone call if your child says they do not feel well. If it becomes necessary, we will depend on the daytime phone numbers and emergency contacts that you have provided for us on the day camp registration form. Please give us the most useful daytime contact information possible.

If a child has an infectious illness, such as pink eye, ringworm, diarrhea, vomiting, etc. they may not attend the program and should remain fever-free (without the use of fever-reducing medications) for 24 hours before returning. Depending on the illness, they will need a doctor's note to return to the program.

Field Trips

Due to COVID, field trips will be significantly limited this year. In the event we are able to go somewhere, please note the following

Field trip days are predominantly on Fridays and are a full day of camp (9am-5pm); however, some field trips could fall on other days or changes may be made to the schedule. In the event of any changes, you will be notified. **Field trip fees are included in your registration fee.** Please provide spending money for your child if they would like additional snacks or souvenirs.

We ask that you are aware of the following important information with regard to field trips:

- 1. Spending money for snacks, souvenirs, etc. should be the only money campers bring on field trips.
- 2. Counselors will NOT be responsible for any campers' money. (Nor can a counselor be responsible for how much a camper spends on field trips.) Each camper, regardless of their age, will need to assume FULL responsibility for any monies they bring on field trips. We ask that you place the spending money in the provided waterproof pouch.
- 3. If the campers are asked to bring their lunch from home for a field trip, we request that you send it in a disposable bag, as opposed to a small cooler. Bag lunches are easier to transport on field trip days and are disposable. Be sure to mark your camper's name on the bag. We will be unable to refrigerate lunches on field trip days. Please pack a lunch that is non-perishable.
- 4. It is **MANDATORY** that all campers wear their camp shirts on field trips **No exceptions!!**
- 5. Please send your child to camp with sunscreen already applied. Sunscreen is something we strongly recommend you send with your camper for any field trips held outside. <u>Our counselors will be able to provide maintenance sunscreen throughout the day, but, if your child uses a specific kind, please make sure to provide that sunscreen for our counselors. Otherwise, a generic children's spray sunscreen will be applied by our counselors.</u>
- 6. EMERGENCIES. Should you have an emergency and need to reach your child or camp staff during a field trip, please call our offices at 336-996-3062 and someone will contact the camp staff.
- 7. FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE MAY BE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

Swimming

The day the camp will be swimming will be TBD. Newsletters will be given out on Mondays informing you on the schedule for the week! Campers will enjoy swimming time at the Abbington Swim Club. Campers should bring a bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, and a plastic bag for clothes. Please send your child to camp with sunscreen already applied. A certified lifeguard and the camp staff will be supervising during swim time. Campers will be required to take a swim test before being allowed to swim in the deep end of the pool. Campers who do not know how to swim, or those with limited skills, will be limited to the shallow end of the pool.

***Should you prefer your child/ren not be allowed in the water, please let us know in writing.

Transportation

Transportation on field trip days and during the week to local parks, venues, and swimming will be provided by the Town of Kernersville on a Chartered School Bus with a professionally trained and background checked driver.

Quiet time (Socially Distanced)

There will be a structured quiet time in an air-conditioned room for campers at some time throughout the day. Campers will rest by participating in a quiet activity (i.e. books, cards, coloring, etc.). Please note that this time is set aside for a brief rest and not for sleeping.

Lunches

Your camper will need to bring their lunch everyday in a bag, small lunchbox, etc. Please be sure the lunches are labeled with your camper's name. Lunches will not be refrigerated. Please be conscious of what you are sending in your camper's lunches-i.e. please do not send items with a high-risk of allergic reactions for other campers (peanuts, etc.) Regarding field trip lunches – please read the section on field trips. An afternoon snack time will be allotted each day for you to send a snack from home with your camper. **Make sure your camper knows which food is snack and which food is for lunch!**

Lost and Found Items

It is amazing how much is lost (and found) during the course of Summer Camp! A lost and found box will be located in the gym at KPRD. Please check it regularly. Any items remaining in the lost and found box at the end of camp will be donated to a charity.

Weekly Information to Parents

Beginning the first week of camp, a weekly newsletter will be published for the parents. The newsletter should be emailed every Monday. The newsletter will contain information on field trips, swimming, weekly camp themes and activities, etc.

Clothing/Camp Attire

Although KPRD is air-conditioned, we urge you to dress your camper in cool, comfortable clothing. We also request that your camper wear some type of closed toe shoes, preferably tennis shoes – **NO sandals, flip-flops,** etc. (UNLESS they are being packed to wear to the pool). We require that campers wear their shoes at all times. NOTE: On field trip days, it is **MANDATORY** that campers wear their camp t-shirts!!

Toys/Electronics

Toys, games, electronics (Gameboys, IPods, cell phones, etc.) will not be permitted during camp time. We are not responsible for any lost or stolen electronic items. If your child wishes to bring a specific game from home to share with the group, please set it up with your counselor.

Participant Conduct

It is very important that both you and your child be aware of both the rules and subsequent consequences. We ask that you read and discuss this page together with your child. Campers must obey rules for the safety of themselves as well as for their fellow campers:

Summer Camp Rules:

- 1. Follow directions of ALL camp staff.
- 2. Be considerate and respectful to EVERYONE. Fighting, hitting, kicking, stealing, teasing, destruction of equipment or property, use of profanity or name-calling will NOT be tolerated and could result in **immediate** suspension.
- 3. Keep hands and feet to self.
- 4. Be respectful of your surroundings.

Summer Camp Consequences Procedures:

- 1. Verbal warning by Counselor.
- 2. Camper will be placed in time-out for 5–15 minutes (depending on age of camper) and privileges may be taken away, i.e. swim time, game time, or field trips.
- 3. Verbal conference with camper, counselor and camp director and a written discipline report will be sent home.
- 4. Three (3) written disciplinary reports on one camper will result in AT LEAST a two (2) day suspension from camp. A parent or guardian will be called for a conference with the camp director and appropriate staff. **Days suspended will run at Camp Directors digressions concurrently. Full refunds will not be given in case of suspension**.
- 5. Expulsion from camp. The use or possession of drugs, alcohol, paraphernalia, or weapons will result in immediate expulsion.

Depending on the severity of the offense, any and all steps in the Consequences Procedures may be eliminated and or combined. Camp rules and consequences will be posted at KPRD. All rules will be read aloud and discussed each Monday.

Problems

If a participant chooses not to follow the camp rules, the parent will be asked to work together with the supervisor and the child to solve the problem. Parents will be notified of any problems that their child may have or cause in the camp. If your child is having a problem at camp and the counselors are not aware, please contact the camp director so that we can work together to ensure that all campers are safe and having a good time. Behavior plans and Inclusion support services are available for campers with attention, behavior, and learning differences. Contact the Camp Director (hwood@toknc.com) to initiate this process.
